Apple Caramel Dip

1 8oz package Cream Cheese

½ Cup brown sugar

½ Cup white sugar

1 Tsp. vanilla

1 8 oz. Jar caramel/butterscotch topping

1 pkg. SKOR bits

Granny Smith Apples sliced (dunk in lemon juice to prevent browning)

Beat the cream cheese with the sugars, vanilla, and ½ the SKOR bits until smooth. Spread thinly in a large serving plate or shallow pie plate. Spread the caramel/butterscotch on top of the cream cheese. Sprinkle the remaining SKOR bits on tops. Serve with the sliced Granny Smith apples for dipping.



Update on Boating Education Courses, 2022/2023

Boating 2/3 (blended learning model): During the winter of 2022, sixteen students were enrolled in Boating 2/3, offered nationally by Peterborough Squadron. Many thanks to course facilitators Doug Hagan and Leigh Mellow, and our faithful group of course tutors, who met every Tuesday evening to review course material and practice quiz material. This course wraps up at the end of April, but we will be offering the course again in the winter of 2023. The course provides information about essential boating skills, docking, anchoring, towing, safety, environmental concerns, and an introduction to navigation and charting. This course is the foundation for higher -level courses in near and offshore cruising. Don't miss your opportunity to enroll. The course will be listed on the calendar by the fall of 2022.

Maritime Radio (completely online with a virtual exam using Zoom technology) Our licensed Maritime Radio Examiner, Munroe Scott (s), is currently facilitating the Maritime Radio course for Peterborough squadron. This fully online course is listed on the national course calendar with a start date of April 15th. You can register anytime for this course, because there is no actual start and end date. You simply log on, review the online materials, do the practice sessions, and then book a virtual examination with Munroe. The exam is undertaken using Zoom technology. Upon successful completion, you will receive your ROC (M) license that allows you to legally operate your on -board radio. Don't be caught out in the water in an emergency without a radio!!! It is illegal to have a radio on board if you do not have the ROC (M) license. This online course will be available year-round and is really time- efficient as you study on your own schedule from the convenience of your own home.

Boating 4 (Seamanship): This course provides instruction and practice in boating skills, knotting and splicing, safety challenges and advanced navigation/charting/plotting training that boaters require to safely cruise in near -shore waters. The course builds on concepts introduced in Boating 2/3. Later in the spring, you can check out the national website course calendar to see the Peterborough course and complete online enrolment. We expect to offer Boating 4 beginning in September 2022 as a virtual/blended learning course with weekly quizzes and mentoring. Pre-registration requirement: Boating 2/3 (Previously known as Boating Essentials (2) and Introduction to Navigation (3)).

**Recreational Vessel Courtesy Checks
At Reach Harbour, June 17th and June 18th, 2022

Peterborough Squadron, in collaboration with Reach Harbour Marina, Buckhorn, will be undertaking two days of recreational vessel courtesy checks on June 17th (4:00 p.m. to 6:00 p.m.), and Saturday, June 18th, ((10:00 a.m. until 4:00 p.m.). This is a wonderful opportunity for boaters to have CPS come alongside your vessel at the dock and go through a checklist to ensure that all required safety equipment is on board and in good working order before you set out on the water! You will receive a sticker if you have everything you need!

If you are stopped by the OPP, you will be required to have on board, fully operational equipment for the size and type of vessel that you own. Be prepared and save your money for recreation, not fines for non-compliance with vessel safety equipment issues. Note: participating in a CPS RVCC event and securing a sticker does not mean you will escape being pulled over – but the experience will provide you with information to be prepared!
